Andreia Schurt Rauber holds an MA and a PhD in Applied Linguistics from the Federal University of Santa Catarina, Brazil. Her research focused on the perception and production of English sounds by foreign language speakers. She worked as Researcher at the University of Minho, and both as Researcher and Adjunct Professor at the Catholic University of Pelotas, Brazil. She left academia in 2012 to work with Speech Technology and Machine Translation for Nuance, Google, and Microsoft. Missing the academic environment, she started an MA in Computational Linguistics at the University of Tübingen, Germany. During part of this period, she worked as a volunteer in the team of researchers from the University of Valladolid who developed TipTopTalk!, an Android application that makes use of Google's automatic speech recognition and text-to-speech conversion technologies to provide users with a game to learn foreign language sounds. She currently works as Speech Scientist at Nuance-Aachen, Germany, helping develop speech dialog and navigation systems for the automotive industry.
